COMES NOW the Tulalip Tribes, Plaintiff, by and through its prosecuting authority, to petition the Court to institute proceedings for the forfeiture of the property described in section I, below. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over these proceedings, and this Petition is made pursuant to, Chapter 2.60 of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law.

I. SUBJECT PROPERTY

As described in detail in Tulalip Police Incident Report #23-1762, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 14^h day of June, 2023, Tulalip Tribal Police (TPD) seized a 2012 Chevrolet Silverado & VIN #1GCNCSE9CZ205537 from Sergio Sandoval Jr. (driver) in the east parking lot of the Quil Ceda Creek Casino located at 6221 31st Ave. NE, Tulalip, Washington, in connection with narcotics trafficking on the Tulalip Reservation.

II. AUTHORITY

Because the Subject Vehicle was used or was intended to be used to facilitate the transportation, sale, receipt, possession, or concealment of a controlled substance, listed chemical, or proceeds from the sale of a controlled substance in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(5).



1 Sergio Sandoval, Jr., driver, from whom the subject property was seized, the legal owner 2 of the vehicle, Sergio Segura Perez, and the credit agency, Sound Credit Union, are the only 3 entities that the Tribes knows or has reason to believe has or may asset a claim to the subject 4 property. Sergio Sandoval, Jr. is believed to reside at 233 Dorn, Everett, Washington 98208 5 (Police Report/DOL). Sergio Segura Perez is believed to reside at 233 Dorn, Everett, 6 Washington 98208 (Police Report/DOL). Sound Credit Union is located at P.O. Box 1595, 7 Tacoma, Washington 98401. 8 IV.
