No extension of the time for filing the response may be granted. Failure to respond within 30 days may bar you from presenting evidence at any later evidentiary hearing regarding the seized property. Further, if no response is filed within 30 days after service of the petition and summons, the Court, upon motion of the Tribes, shall order the property forfeited to the Tribes.

The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over these proceedings, and this Petition is made pursuant to, Chapter 2.60 of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law.

I. Subject Property

As described in detail in Tulalip Tribes Police Department Incident Report #23-3952, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 12th day of December, 2023, Tulalip Tribes Police Department (TTPD) seized \$939 Dollars in U.S. Currency from Alyssa Snow in the vicinity of 10200 Quil Ceda Blvd., Tulalip, WA 98271 in connection with narcotic trafficking on the Tulalip Reservation.

Because the Subject Money was furnished or intended to be furnished by any person in exchange for a controlled substance or listed chemical in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(7).
