COMES NOW the Tulalip Tribes, Plaintiff, by and through its prosecuting authority, to petition the Court to institute proceedings for the forfeiture of the property described in section I, below. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over these proceedings, and this Petition is made pursuant to, Chapter 2.60 of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law.

I. **SUBJECT PROPERTY**

As described in detail in Tulalip Police Incident Report #19-0841, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 15th day of March, 2019, Tulalip Tribal Police (TPD) seized a 2008 Chrysler 300, VIN #2C3KA43R28H244252 from Stahawnee Williams (driver) in the vicinity of 6410 33rd Avenue NE, Tulalip, Washington in connection with narcotics trafficking charges on the Tulalip Reservation.

AUTHORITY П.

Because the Subject Vehicle was used or was intended to be used to facilitate the transportation, sale, receipt, possession, or concealment of a controlled substance, listed chemical, or proceeds from the sale of a controlled substance in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(5).



1	III. CLAIMANTS
2	Stahawnee Williams, driver/legal owner, from whom the subject property was seized, is
3	the only people who the Tribes knows or has reason to believe has or may asset a claim to the
4	subject property. Stahawnee Williams is believed to be housed at the Snohomish County Jail
5	located at 3025 Oakes Avenue, Everett, Washington (Jail Registry).
6	IV. CONCLUSION
7	Based upon the foregoing, the Tribes requests the Clerk of the Court issue a Summons
8	to have Stahawnee Williams answer the allegations of this Petition, and, ultimately, for the Court
9	to order that the Subject Property be forfeited for the benefit of the Tulalip Tribes.
