I. SUBJECT PROPERTY

As described in detail in Tulalip Police Incident Report #20-0976, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 27th day of April, 2020, Tulalip Tribal Police (TPD) seized a \$3,184 from Rodolfo Hernandez in the vicinity of 1100 block of Marine Drive NE, Tulalip, Washington in connection with narcotics trafficking on the Tulalip Reservation.

II. AUTHORITY

Because the Subject Money was furnished or intended to be furnished by any person in exchange for a controlled substance or listed chemical in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(7).
