#### I. SUBJECT PROPERTY

As described in detail in Tulalip Police Incident Report #20-2664, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October, 2020, Tulalip Tribal Police (TPD) seized a 2009 Kia Optima & VIN # KNAGE228395321672 from Michael Twedt (driver) and Amy Hartlmueller-Torres (registered owner) in the vicinity of 10200 Quil Ceda Blvd., Tulalip, Washington in connection with narcotics trafficking on the Tulalip Reservation.

#### II. AUTHORITY

Because the Subject Vehicle was used or was intended to be used to facilitate the transportation, sale, receipt, possession, or concealment of a controlled substance, listed chemical, or proceeds from the sale of a controlled substance in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(5).

#### **III. CLAIMANTS**

Michael Twedt, driver, from whom the subject property was seized and the registered owner of the vehicle, Amy Hartlmueller-Torres, are the only people who the Tribes knows or has reason to believe has or may asset a claim to the subject property. Michael Twedt is believed to reside at PMB 170, 10924 Mukilteo Speedway, Mukilteo, Washington 98275 (Police Report). Amy Hartlmueller-Torres is believed to reside at 25011 222<sup>nd</sup> Ct. SE, Maple Valley, Washington 98038 (Police Report).

### IV. CONCLUSION

Based upon the foregoing, the Tribes requests the Clerk of the Court issue a Summons to have [LIST ALL PARTIES INVOLVED] answer the allegations of this Petition, and, ultimately, for the Court to order that the Subject Property be forfeited for the benefit of the Tulalip Tribes.
