No extension of the time for filing the response may be granted. Failure to respond within 30 days may bar you from presenting evidence at any later evidentiary hearing regarding the seized property. Further, if no response is filed within 30 days after service of the petition and summons, the Court, upon motion of the Tribes, shall order the property forfeited to the Tribes.

Chapter 2.60.070§(4)(b) governs responses to forfeiture petitions. The Clerk's Office does not provide legal advice. It is your responsibility to familiarize yourself with the applicable

COMES NOW the Tulalip Tribes, Plaintiff, by and through its prosecuting authority, to petition the Court to institute proceedings for the forfeiture of the property described in section I, below. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over these proceedings, and this Petition is made pursuant to, Chapter 2.60 of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law.

## I. SUBJECT PROPERTY

As described in detail in Tulalip Police Incident Report #19-1665, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2019, Tulalip Tribal Police (TPD) seized a 2016 Jeep Wrangler & VIN #1C4BJWEG0GL304632 from Scott Shelton (driver) in the vicinity of 2627 116<sup>th</sup> Street NE, Tulalip, Washington in connection with narcotics trafficking on the Tulalip Reservation.

## II. AUTHORITY

Because the Subject Vehicle was used or was intended to be used to facilitate the transportation, sale, receipt, possession, or concealment of a controlled substance, listed chemical, or proceeds from the sale of a controlled substance in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(5).



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## III. CLAIMANTS

Scott Shelton, driver, from whom the subject property was seized, the registered owner of the vehicle, John Lidral, and Cashmere Valley Bank, legal owner of the vehicle, are the only people who the Tribes knows or has reason to believe has or may asset a claim to the subject property. Scott Shelton is believed to be residing at 10141 Naneum Road, Ellensburg, Washington 98926 (Police Report). John Lidral is believed to be residing at 564 Iron Horse Road, Easton, Washington 98925 (Police Report). Cashmere Valley Bank is located at 124 E. Penny Road, Suite 201, Wenatchee, Washington 98801 (Police Report).

## IV. CONCLUSION

Based upon the foregoing, the Tribes requests the Clerk of the Court issue a Summons to have Scott Shelton, John Lidral and Cashmere Valley Bank answer the allegations of this Petition, and, ultimately, for the Court to order that the Subject Property be forfeited for the benefit of the Tulalip Tribes.
