

Further, if no response is filed within 30 days after service of the petition and summons, the Court, upon motion of the Tribes, shall order the property forfeited to the Tribes.

COMES NOW the Tulalip Tribes, Plaintiff, by and through its prosecuting authority, to petition the Court to institute proceedings for the forfeiture of the property described in section I, below. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over these proceedings, and this Petition is made pursuant to, Chapter 2.60 of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law.

I. SUBJECT PROPERTY

As described in detail in Tulalip Police Incident Report #18-2670, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 5th day of September, 2018, Tulalip Tribal Police (TPD) seized a \$420 from Benjamin Adams in the vicinity of 10200 Quil Ceda Blvd., Tulalip, Washington in connection with narcotics trafficking on the Tulalip Reservation.

II. AUTHORITY

Because the Subject Money was furnished or intended to be furnished by any person in exchange for a controlled substance or listed chemical in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(7).

1	III. CLAIMANTS
2	Benjamin Adams, from whom the subject property was seized, is the only person who
3	the Tribes knows or has reason to believe has or may assert a claim to the subject property. He
4	is believed to reside at 3625 150th Place NE, Apt. 2, Marysville, WA 98271 (Police Report).
5	IV. CONCLUSION
6	Based upon the foregoing, the Tribes requests the Clerk of the Court issue a Summons
7	to have Benjamin Adams answer the allegations of this Petition, and, ultimately, for the Court
8	to order that the Subject Property be forfeited for the benefit of the Tulalip Tribes.
