Pursuant to Chapter 2.60.070§(4)(a), of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law, you have thirty (30) days after you have been served the petition and this summons to file with the Court a response to the allegations described in the petition. No extension of the time for filing the response may be granted. Failure to respond within 30 days may bar you from presenting evidence at any later evidentiary hearing regarding the seized property. Further, if no response is filed within 30 days after service of the petition and summons, the Court, upon motion of the Tribes, shall order the property forfeited to the Tribes.

COMES NOW the Tulalip Tribes, Plaintiff, by and through its prosecuting authority, to petition the Court to institute proceedings for the forfeiture of the property described in section I, below. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over these proceedings, and this Petition is

I. SUBJECT PROPERTY

made pursuant to, Chapter 2.60 of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law.

As described in detail in Tulalip Police Incident Report #19-1194, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 15th day of April, 2019, Tulalip Tribal Police (TPD) seized a 2002 Lexus IS300 VIN # JTHBD172120052066 from Jay Anderson (driver/registered owner) in the vicinity of 727 56th Street NW, Tulalip, Washington in connection with narcotics trafficking on the Tulalip Reservation.

II. AUTHORITY

Because the Subject Vehicle was used or was intended to be used to facilitate the transportation, sale, receipt, possession, or concealment of a controlled substance, listed chemical, or proceeds from the sale of a controlled substance in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(5).

1	III. CLAIMANTS
2	Jay Anderson, driver/registered owner, from whom the subject property was seized, the
3	registered owner of the vehicle, is the only people who the Tribes knows or has reason to believe
4	has or may asset a claim to the subject property. Jay Anderson is believed to be located in the
5	Snohomish County Jail located at 3025 Oakes Avenue, Everett, Washington 98201 (Jail
6	Registry).
7	IV. CONCLUSION
8	Based upon the foregoing, the Tribes requests the Clerk of the Court issue a Summons
9	to have Jay Anderson answer the allegations of this Petition, and, ultimately, for the Court to
10	order that the Subject Property be forfeited for the benefit of the Tulalip Tribes.
