Pursuant to Chapter 2.60.070§(4)(a), of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law, you have thirty (30) days after you have been served the petition and this summons to file with the Court a response to the allegations described in the petition. No extension of the time for filing the response may be granted. Failure to respond within 30 days may bar you from presenting evidence at any later evidentiary hearing regarding the seized property. Further, if no response is filed within 30 days after service of the petition and summons, the Court, upon motion of the Tribes, shall order the property forfeited to the Tribes.

Chapter 2.60.070§(4)(b) governs responses to forfeiture petitions. The Clerk's Office does not provide legal advice. COMES NOW the Tulalip Tribes, Plaintiff, by and through its prosecuting authority, to petition the Court to institute proceedings for the forfeiture of the property described in section I, below. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over these proceedings, and this Petition is made pursuant to, Chapter 2.60 of the Tulalip Tribes Code of Law.

## I. Subject Property

As described in detail in Tulalip Tribes Police Department Incident Report #25-0483, which is on file with the Tulalip Tribal Court under this cause number, on or about the 20th day of February, 2025, Tulalip Tribes Police Department (TTPD) seized a Vega .45 ACP, Serial No. 3256 firearm from Thomas Olsen in the vicinity of I5 off-ramp, Exit 199, Tulalip, WA 98271 as a prohibited weapon that was unlawfully carried by Thomas Olsen for concealing a firearm without a permit on the Tulalip Reservation.

## II. AUTHORITY

Because the Subject Firearm was furnished or intended to be furnished by any person in exchange for a controlled substance or listed chemical in violation of Tulalip Law, it is subject to forfeiture pursuant to Tulalip Tribal Code 2.60.020§(9).
